PASMO

PASMO is a convenient reloadable, prepaid transportation IC card that allows its users to ride Tokyo Metro subways and most trains and buses within Japan.

Where to Purchase and Recharge the Card

Can be purchased at Tokyo Metro IC card-compatible ticket vending machines, Tokyo Metro station offices, and at Tokyo Metro Pass Offices.

How to Use the Card

Just touch the IC card reader on the ticket gate with your PASMO card. One advantage of using PASMO is that it lets you easily pay fares without having to calculate costs each time you go to get somewhere.

You can also use the money you loaded on your PASMO card to purchase items at stores and vending machines marked with the PASMO/SUICA logos.

Valid Period

There is no expiration date for the PASMO card (It will be invalid if not used for more than 10 years from the date of last usage).

Valid Transit Lines

You can use PASMO to ride not only Tokyo Metro subways but also most trains and buses throughout Japan.

If the PASMO Card Is No Longer Needed PASMO can be returned to the user. Any remaining balance for stored fares (SF) and ¥500 deposit are returned to the user.

Amount of money returned to the user = SF (remaining balance) * 1 + ¥500 deposit * 2

Fares

The fares for the Tokyo Metro lines vary depending on the type of ticket you use. Regular Tokyo Metro tickets are available in amounts of ¥170, ¥200, ¥240, ¥280, and ¥310, increasing with the distance of travel. For prepaid transportation IC cards such as the PASMO card, a fee of ¥165, ¥195, ¥237, ¥278, or ¥308 is charged, increasing with the distance of travel.

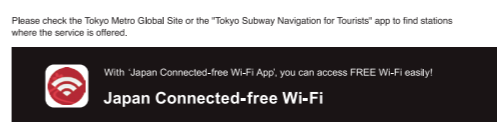
FREE Wi-Fi

Service Managers (10:00-17:00)

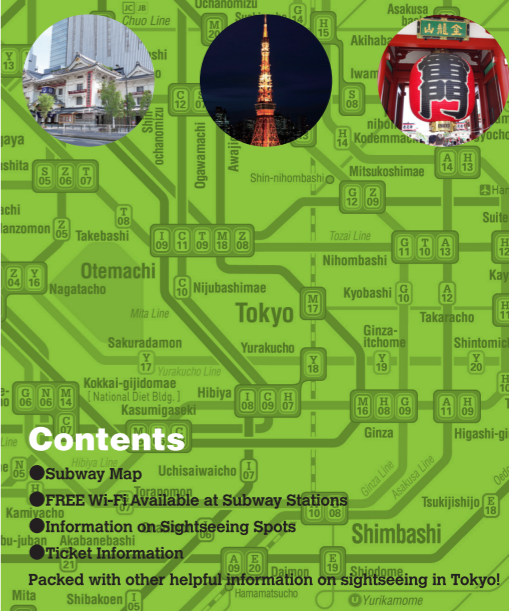

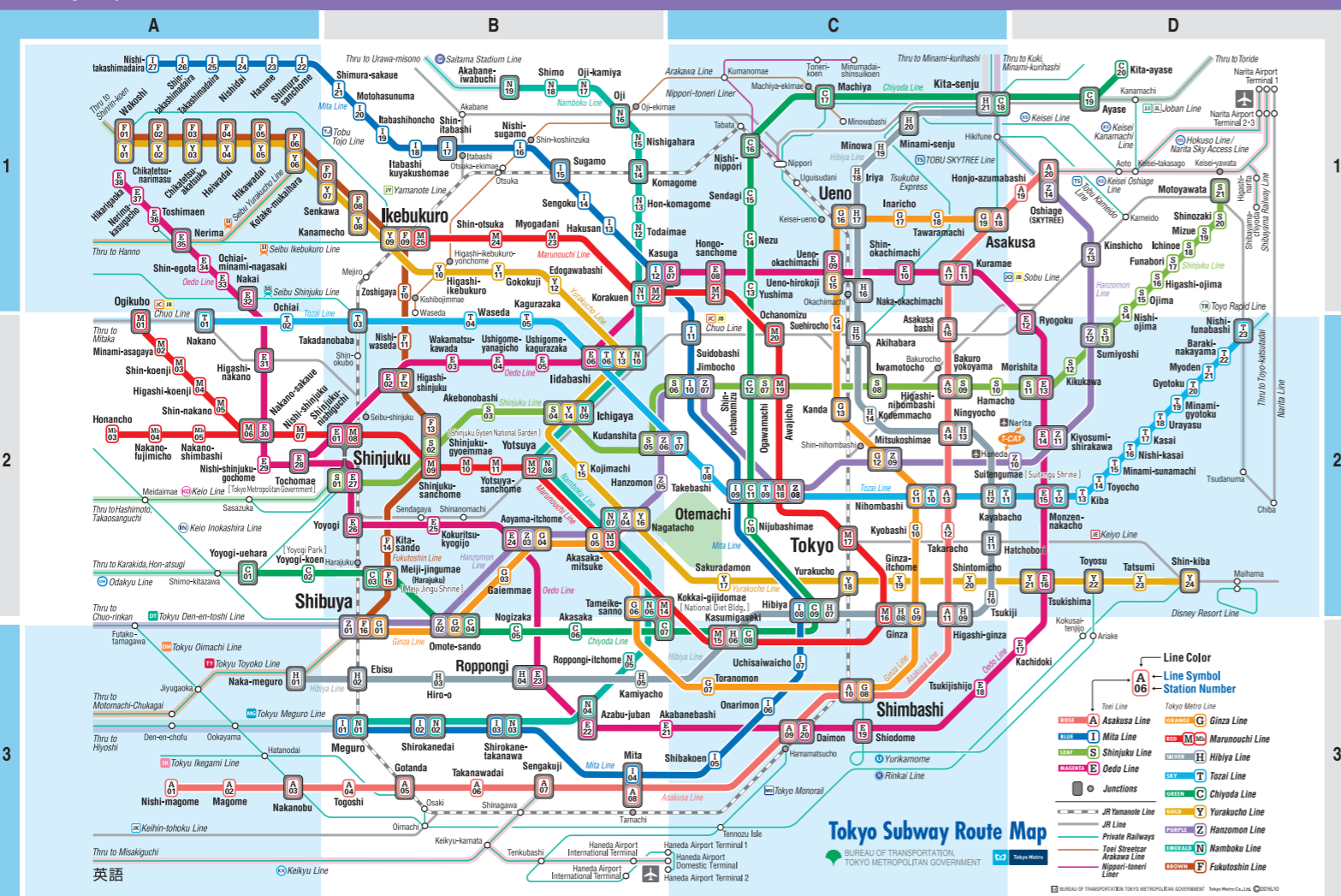

If you use Tokyo Metro, which runs through every corner of Tokyo, you'll be able to cover everything. With that in mind, here's a route that enables you to check out the popular spots in just one day!

Plan A

9:30 Asakusa
Sightseeing 浅草 Asakusa (G19 A18)
Subway Map Index C1
A busy sightseeing area bustling with many people, centered around Senso-ji Temple, visited by approximately 30 million people annually, and Nakamise Dori, the oldest shopping street in the Tokyo metropolitan area. A wide array of events and festivals are held throughout the year.

12:30 Ginza
Shopping 銀座 Ginza (G09 M18 H08)
Subway Map Index C2
Experience both the "now" and "then" of Tokyo in Ginza. On streets that have a historical atmosphere, you'll find a diverse range of stores from world-famous luxury brands to reasonable shops. The Kabukiza Theatre can also be found in the outskirts.

15:00 Tokyo Metropolitan Government No.1 Building
Sightseeing 東京都庁第一本庁舎 Nishi-shinjuku (H07) Tochomae (E20)
Subway Map Index A2
With an overwhelming scale, the administrative central facility of the Tokyo metropolitan government is one of the largest in Japan. On the 45th floor, in addition to the observatory where you can get a full view of the city of Tokyo for free, there's also a souvenir shop and restaurant on the same floor, making it the perfect rest spot.

17:00 Roppongi Hills
Sightseeing 六本木ヒルズ Roppongi (H04 E23)
Subway Map Index B3
A complex facility built with the concept of a being as a new Tokyo cultural center. A place where you can enjoy not only shopping and gourmet food, but also a beautiful Japanese garden that showcases Japan's four seasons, as well as the works of well-known artists displayed at various areas within the complex.

11:30 Tsukiji Outer Market
Japanese food 築地場外市場 Tsukiji (H10) Tsukijishijo (E18)
Subway Map Index C2/C3
Tsukiji Market is one of the largest fish markets in the world, handling not only fresh seafood but fruit and vegetables, etc. The outer market has a shopping street that caters to the public. Long-established restaurants where you can enjoy sushi at reasonable prices, and more. If you are lucky, you might even see a tuna filleting show.

12:30 Ginza
Shopping 銀座 Ginza (G09 M18 H08)
Subway Map Index C2
Experience both the "now" and "then" of Tokyo in Ginza. On streets that have a historical atmosphere, you'll find a diverse range of stores from world-famous luxury brands to reasonable shops. The Kabukiza Theatre can also be found in the outskirts.

15:00 Tokyo Metropolitan Government No.1 Building
Sightseeing 東京都庁第一本庁舎 Nishi-shinjuku (H07) Tochomae (E20)
Subway Map Index A2
With an overwhelming scale, the administrative central facility of the Tokyo metropolitan government is one of the largest in Japan. On the 45th floor, in addition to the observatory where you can get a full view of the city of Tokyo for free, there's also a souvenir shop and restaurant on the same floor, making it the perfect rest spot.

17:00 Roppongi Hills
Sightseeing 六本木ヒルズ Roppongi (H04 E23)

11:30 Meguro Gajoen
Japanese food 目黒雅叙園 Meguro (H01 H01)
Subway Map Index B3
Including the main restaurant "SHUNYUKI," there are "TOFUTEL" that offers Japanese cuisine that highlights seasonal tastes, "Club Lounge" buffet restaurant that offers Western cuisine, "YUI-AN" cafe and bar, etc. are housed in the hotel.

14:00 The Outer Gardens of the Imperial Palace
Culture 皇居外苑 Otemachi (M18 T09 G11 T08 T09)
Subway Map Index C2
The area that includes the Outer Gardens of the Imperial Palace is the former site of Edo Castle and one can see something of what the castle looked like from the moats that surround the Imperial Palace. The gardens are open to the public in Japan and present a changing face throughout the seasons, with cherry blossoms in spring and potted ginkgo leaves in the fall.

17:30 Ueno
Shopping 上野 Ueno (G16 H17)

Hotel New Otani Tokyo that boasts a huge Japanese garden in the premises. After enjoying its beautiful scenery, experience a traditional Japanese tea ceremony in the hotel tea house. It's the perfect way to readily get in touch with traditional Japanese culture, even if you are a beginner. (Teahouse open from Thu. to Sat. only.)

15:30 Akihabara
Shopping 秋葉原 Akihabara (H15) Suehirocho (G14)
Subway Map Index C2
Akihabara is a town that attracts all the attention from the world as the world's largest capital for electronics goods of all kinds. Akihabara spotlights and introduces the culture of manga, anime, video games, etc., highlighting another major culture of Japan. It's very popular as the Cool Japan culture spot.

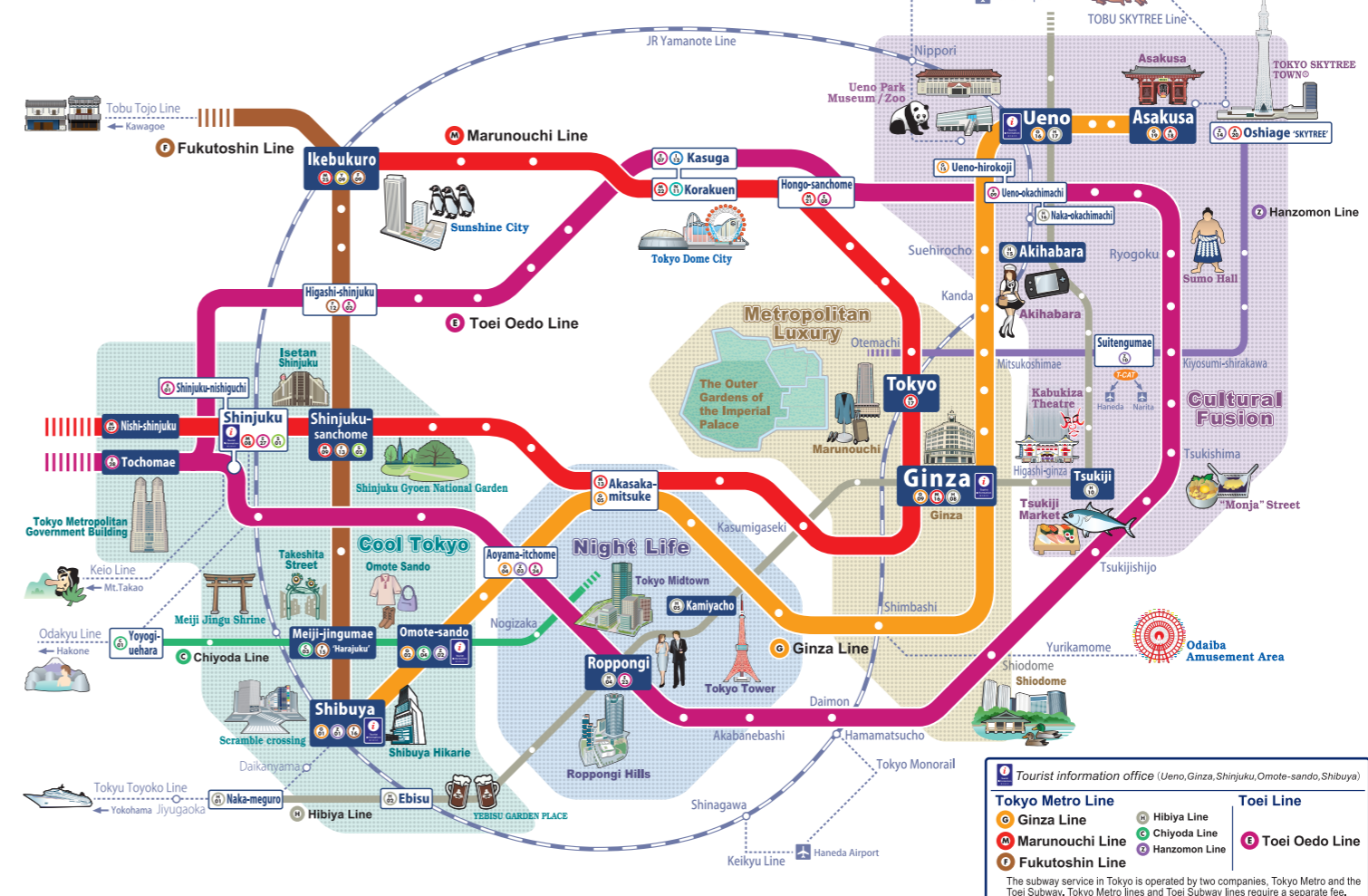

The subway service in Tokyo is operated by two companies, Tokyo Metro and the Toei Subway. Tokyo Metro lines and Toei Subway lines require a separate fee.

- Cool Tokyo**
Let's check out and visit spots that everyone is talking about, where you'll find the latest fashion and popular items.
- Isetan Shinjuku**
Shopping 伊勢丹新宿店
Reopened in 2013 under the theme of "world-class fashion museum." In 2015, two more floors of interior goods (5th) and babies and kids (6th) were remodeled, offering more to see.
Access: Shinjuku-sanchoe (M13 F13 S02)
- Tokyo Metropolitan Government No.1 Building**
Sightseeing 東京都庁第一本庁舎
Located at a height of 202m above ground level, the North and South observation decks which are free of charge, are popular spots. View the TOKYO SKYTREE® and Mount Fuji, and at night, enjoy Tokyo's night skyline.
Access: Nishi-shinjuku (H07) Tochomae (E20)
- Omote Sando-Takeshita Street**
Shopping 表参道・竹下通り
This is an area attracting the world's attention as the source of latest fashion lead by young people. In recent years, shops for overseas tourists have also been popping up.
Access: Omote-sando (G02 C04 T02) Meiji-jingumae (Harajuku) (G03 E13)
- Shibuya Hikarie**
Shopping 渋谷ヒカリエ
A new place of interest with direct access from Shibuya stn. A variety of stores can be found, from "ShinQs" which offers fashion accessories to restaurants where food from all over the world, as well as long-established food shops offering their traditional wares, can be enjoyed.
Access: Shibuya (G01 T01 E16)

- Night Life**
Art, night view, music, etc. the other side of Tokyo where you can enjoy the "Night"
- Tokyo Tower**
Sightseeing 東京タワー
The 333m-high broadcasting tower, known as a symbol of Tokyo. The main observation deck offers a breathtaking, sweeping view of Tokyo. The night view is spectacular and the illuminated tower is a major sightseeing attraction.
Access: Kamiyacho (H05) Akabanebashi (E21)
- The National Art Center, Tokyo**
Culture 国立新美術館
Instead of maintaining a permanent collection, this museum uses its exhibition space, one of the largest in Japan, to hold various art exhibitions and is attracting public attention. Museum hours are extended to 20:00 every Friday when an exhibition is being held.
Access: Nogizaka (E05)
- Tokyo Midtown**
Sightseeing 東京ミッドタウン
Full of shops offering a comfortable lifestyle. You'll also find places with live, high-quality music as well as restaurants and cafes.
Access: Roppongi (H04 E23)
- Roppongi Hills**
Sightseeing 六本木ヒルズ
This multi-complex features a movie theater, museum, restaurants and more. With the completion of reopening after remodeling, they now offer an even greater collection of luxury brand boutiques and shops carrying a selection of various brands.
Access: Roppongi (H04 E23)

- Metropolitan Luxury**
If you want to enjoy a touch of luxury, head out to the world-leading area of brand-name shops
- The Outer Gardens of the Imperial Palace**
Culture 皇居外苑
An abundant green area, the Imperial Palace is a place where you can relax and unwind. In addition to the tourist spot Nijubashi Bridge (which means the "Double Bridge"), you can enjoy viewing historical buildings that have been designated as nationally important cultural properties as well as the rich colors of the four seasons.
Access: Otemachi (M18 T09 G11 T08 T09)
- Marunouchi**
Shopping 丸の内
Latest landmarks are popping up in the Marunouchi area, including "KITTE" located in front of Tokyo stn. Along the street, you'll find very unique luxury brand shops and restaurants as well.
Access: Tokyo (M17)
- Ginza**
Shopping 銀座
This is a world-leading shopping district where shops of both long-established and cutting-edge brands line the streets. Also, in addition to high-class restaurants, you can also enjoy art at the numerous galleries.
Access: Ginza (G09 M18 H08)
- Shiodome**
Sightseeing 汐留
In the multitude of high-rise buildings in Shiodome, you'll find numerous restaurants that offer sweeping views of areas such as Odaiba. Find cuisine from all around the world and enjoy a good time in exquisite elegance.
Access: Shiodome (E19)

- Cultural Fusion**
From pop culture to new places of interest, take a tour around Tokyo's popular sightseeing spots
- Tsukiji Outer Market**
Japanese food 築地場外市場
One of the world's largest markets that's crowded from before the break of dawn. You'll have fun just walking around the Outer Market that's full of life. Delicious seafood cuisine made from freshly caught fish and shellfish is not to be missed!
Access: Tsukiji (H10) Tsukijishijo (E18)
- Akihabara**
Shopping 秋葉原
"Akiha" is the sanctuary of electric home appliances, the pride of Japan, and of pop culture. Here you'll find largely discounted home appliances as well as rare anime items and manga.
Access: Akihabara (H15) Suehirocho (G14)
- Ueno**
Shopping 上野
In addition to Ameyoko, where shops selling food, clothing, and accessories are lined up, you'll find numerous leisure spots in Ueno including Ueno Park, known as the "forest of art," and the oldest zoo in Japan.
Access: Ueno (G16 H17)
- Asakusa**
Sightseeing 浅草
A popular sightseeing area with many of Tokyo's new and old tourist spots including Senso-ji Temple and Kaminarimon Gate where there's a friendly atmosphere of an old town. An approximate walk of 20 min. will take you to the new landmark, TOKYO SKYTREE®.
Access: Asakusa (G19 A18)

- SEISEI-AN (Hotel New Otani Tokyo)**
Experience 茶室 清静庵 (ホテルニューオータニ)
Japanese tea ceremony experiences are available three days a week at Seisei-an, a facility within Hotel New Otani Tokyo. For a reasonable price of ¥1000+ tax, anyone, including beginners, can participate in the 10-minute ritual and enjoy "macha" and Japanese sweets.
Access: Akasaka-mitsuke (G05 M13 Nagatacho (T18 T04 T07) Subway Map Index B2
- Meguro Gajoen**
Japanese food 目黒雅叙園
A hotel adorned with authentic, stunning Japanese artworks and handicrafts. With its accommodation facilities and a range of dining options including traditional Japanese cuisine, the hotel offers an opportunity to explore the traditional Japanese culture at your own leisure.
Access: Meguro (H01 H01) Subway Map Index B3
- Suntory Museum of Art**
Culture サントリー美術館
Exhibitors held here focus on Japanese art including paintings, pottery, and glass. There's also a shop with the concept of "Japanese modernism", and a cafe where desserts that use "fu" (wheat-gluten) are popular.
Access: Roppongi (H04 E23) Subway Map Index B3
- Kabukiza**
Sightseeing 歌舞伎座
The Kabukiza Theatre has re-opened with direct access from Higashi Ginza stn. At "Kabukicho Square", located right outside the station ticket gates, you'll find calls as well as shops offering Kabuki-related goods where you can have fun even if you don't have tickets to see the kabuki show.
Access: Higashi-ginza (H09 A11) Subway Map Index C2
- Kappa Bashi**
Culture かつばし橋
Around 170 shops offering kitchen appliances line both sides of the street for a stretch of approximately 800m. Various plastic food models that can easily be called works of art look very real and are perfect for souvenirs.

- Koishikawa Korakuen Gardens**
Sightseeing 小石川後樂園
Koishikawa korakuen gardens is designed and dated in 1628 based on the beautiful scenery from places in Japan and China. The appearance of the garden—the weeping cherry blossom trees, the beautiful landscaped grounds, stone bridges and fery-fake bridges—changes with the seasons and is certainly worth seeing.
